Performance -cum- Achievement Report

The All India Sports Council of the Deaf, popularly known as in brief AISCD, a National Apex Body as well as called as National Sports Federation among in the prime sports federation in the Country recognized by Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs, Government of India, has allotted the 3rd National Deaf Women Sports Championship to Karnataka Sports Federation on the Deaf, Bangaluru, the State Apex Body. The Karnataka Sports Federation of the Deaf, in brief KSFD, has decided to conduct and shoulder full responsibility of hosting the newly constituted National Event. During the Meeting of All India Council of Sports held at Lucknow in February 2009, the formulation of exclusive policies of the sports under AISCD on the promotion of sports amongst women received unstinted support, which serves two objectives as follows:

- 1. The Encourage of Mass Participation in sports for Women and help them in spotting outstanding sports women players and push them for encouragement in International participation.
- 2. The Sports for Deaf Women provides to encourage the new Children to join sports at National and International.

The Government of India, keeping in view the importance of Women's Sports, has launched this scheme of National Sports Championship for Deaf Women from block level to District level and from District level to State Level and upto national and International levels. AISCD with its objective in mind was determined to work out this Government's new policy scheme on women's sports. So the AISCD has constituted the championship to conduct and promote this Sports among Indian Deaf Women at National and International level. But with determination and devotion, shown by all in AISCD, the hosts despite non- release of the grant from the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports Government of India, the Hosts are able to accomplish our mission as a grand success. The 3rd National Deaf Women Sports Championship was successfully conducted at the Shree Kanteerava Stadium, Bangaluru during **28th JANUARY to 1st FEBRUARY, 2010.** The objectives of this championship is to bring out the women having an aptitude for sports into limelight and develop sporting spirit among them. Out of the 20 affiliated bodies of AISCD, 12 state sports units participated in the Championship. The names of states that participated in this as follows:
